What is sexual assault?

Sexual assault is any sexual contact that you do not agree to.

It is an act of violence.

What happened to you was not your fault.

Sexual assault is a traumatic experience. You may be in a state of shock & find it hard to believe this really happened to you. Some people do not remember what happened.

You may feel upset, anxious, depressed, angry, guilty, numb, embarrassed, or ashamed. Some people have nightmares, difficulty eating or sleeping, or are afraid to go outside. You may also be worried about sexually transmitted infections, pregnancy, HIV or injuries.

All of your reactions and feelings are normal. Everyone reacts to traumatic experiences differently.

HOW WE CAN HELP

The Sexual Assault Services team provides sensitive & comprehensive health care to anyone 13 or older who has been sexually assaulted within the past 7 days. Our specially trained nurses & doctors will respond to your healthcare needs in a safe & supportive environment.

ALL SERVICES ARE FREE & CONFIDENTIAL

We will explain what we can offer & answer any questions you might have. You will decide what you would like us to do & we will respect your decisions.

WHAT ABOUT POLICE?

It is your choice whether or not to report the sexual assault to the police. We will support whatever decision you make. If you choose to report to police we can collect forensic samples & send a legal report to the police. Victim services can provide ongoing support throughout this process.

We Offer:

- Free, confidential & supportive services 24 hours a day
- Crisis Counselling
- Short wait & private room
- Caring & knowledgeable nurses, doctors & support workers
- Medical assessment & treatment
- Free medications to prevent pregnancy & sexually transmitted infections
- Option to collect forensic samples, with storage of forensic evidence for up to one year at your discretion
- Trauma-informed support
- Information about & referrals to community support services
